Aston University is a mid-sized dual intensive university ranked in the top 25 universities in the United Kingdom. 

Campus Safety

The Campus Safety department at Aston University ensure that the campus estate and our community are as safe as possible. For Aston to achieve its mission as the UK's leading university for students to succeed in business and the professions, staff and students need to feel safe and confident to achieve this.

The Campus Safety team are equipped with a range of innovative technology, systems and skills, along with significant experience of working not only in security and protection, but also in higher education.

Going to university is an incredibly rewarding and enjoyable experience. For some, it can be a daunting experience and the team offer help and assistance, so students, staff and visitors have a safe and enjoyable experience. Campus Safety protect one of the most multicultural and diverse communities in the UK and welcome students from over 120 countries every year. Security and safety have different meanings depending on where our students originate therefore different approaches will be required to build trust and confidence with these students.

Being positioned in the centre of Birmingham provides opportunities to support Aston's beneficiaries and key stakeholders. Campus Safety have superb relationships with the police, neighbouring education providers, Birmingham City Council and other key stakeholders. As members of the Association of University Chief Security Officers (AUCSO), Campus Safety achieved the award for 'Security Team of the Year' in 2018.

Mission

Vision

In 2023, Aston will have an international reputation for being one of the safest universities to work and study. People will come here not only because of our world-class education, but because they feel safe while they are here and confident that we can enhance the student experience.

Security strategy

The security strategy is divided into three elements: **control** - what is within our reach; **partner** - with those who sit on the periphery and **influence** - upon those who can help make a difference

Control

As we aspire to create a destination campus for our beneficiaries, we must create an open, permeable campus, which welcomes students, staff and the wider community, and encourages them to stay. Whilst it is important that access to the campus is welcoming and user-friendly, this must be balanced with a safe and secure environment, promoting a sense of security and wellbeing for beneficiaries during their time on campus.

To create a safe and secure yet open environment the strategy will build on the emerging theme of a smart campus, by using technological security solutions to ensure that the balance of permeability and security are fully realised.

This will be achieved by:

- effective zoning of the campu to ensure the physical campus remains open and welcoming to the public, whilst discrete buildings/areas of buildings can only be accessed by students/staff.
- Secure by design with effective lighting, wide passages and visible CCTV.
- App-based technology continued roll out of the SafeSmart app to enable fast reporting of issues to security.

We will drive an effective awareness campaign to promote within students, staff and beneficiaries a clear understanding of the security provision and expectations for their behaviour when on campus.

Partner

We will partner and work with neighbouring Universities, businesses and third party university suppliers (eg. Unite) to promote a safe and secure 'Knowledge Quarter', which spans a small geographical area. By pooling resources where possible, and information-sharing, there will be more awareness around risks, promoting improved mitigation and a safer Knowledge Quarter.

Influence

We will work with local bodies to build a safe and secure environment both on campus and within the sphere of influence of the campus. We have a duty of care to our beneficiaries on their journey to the campus and whilst they are on campus. We will ensure an appropriate, flexible and scalable police presence on site and within the local area.
